#### From Fr Trevor

Every year the day after All Saints is All Souls Day. The Saints are those now enjoying heaven, whereas the holy Souls are those first undergoing some purification in purgatory after death in order to fully enjoy heaven. Did you know that our prayers and our sacrifices on earth can help towards the salvation of others, even those who have already died? Since Old Testament times, Jews and Christians have offered prayers for deceased loved ones. Second Maccabees says that:

"if one were not expecting that those who had fallen would rise again, it would have been superfluous and foolish to pray for the dead. But if one was looking to the splendid reward that is laid up for those who fall asleep in godliness, it was a holy and godly thought" (12:44-45). God is the perfect Judge. We are not wise enough to judge fairly or accurately whether someone is in heaven. We certainly hope that our loved ones are in heaven, but this is not the same as judging that they are in heaven for certain – this is not our decision to make. We always trust that God is merciful and wants us to be with Him in heaven – but because we are not the judge, we pray that those who have died may enjoy heaven. This is also a comfort to us because we feel like we are still able to express our love for them.

Catholics have always had Masses offered for deceased loved ones. The Mass is the most powerful prayer we have on earth because it is the perfect offering of the Son to the Father in the communion of the Holy Spirit. It is the sacrifice of Christ on the cross, the perfect sacrifice to the Father which He cannot refuse. The Mass is of infinite value. Our prayers can make a difference and the Mass is the most powerful prayer. Please take an envelope to request a November Mass to be offered. A customary offering is made to the priest who says the Mass (anything from ten dollars), but this is not strictly necessary.

## Liturgy of the Word

First reading Deuteronomy 6:2-6

Moses said to the people: 'If you fear the Lord your God all the days of your life and if you keep all his laws and commandments which I lay on you, you will have a long life, you and your son and your grandson. Listen then, Israel, keep and observe what will make you prosper and give you great increase, as the Lord the God of your fathers has promised you, giving you a land where milk and honey flow.

'Listen, Israel: the Lord our God is the one Lord. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength. Let these words I urge on you today be written on your heart.'

#### **Responsorial Psalm**

Second reading Hebrews 7:23-28

There used to be a great number of priests under the former covenant, because death put an end to each one of them; but this one, because he remains for ever, can never lose his priesthood. It follows, then, that his power to save is utterly certain, since he is living for ever to intercede for all who come to God through him.

To suit us, the ideal high priest would have to be holy, innocent and uncontaminated, beyond the influence of sinners, and raised up above the heavens; one who would not need to offer sacrifices every day, as the other high priests do for their own sins and then for those of the people, because he has done this once and for all by offering himself. The Law appoints high priests who are men subject to weakness; but the promise on oath, which came after the Law, appointed the Son who is made perfect for ever.

#### **Gospel Acclamation**

Alleluia, alleluia! All who love me will keep my words, and my Father will love them, and we will come to them. Alleluia! Gospel Mark 12:28-34

One of the scribes came up to Jesus and put a question to him, 'Which is the first of all the commandments?' Jesus replied, 'This is the first: Listen, Israel, the Lord our God is the one Lord, and you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind and with all your strength. The second is this: You must love your neighbour as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these.' The scribe said to him, 'Well spoken, Master; what you have said is true: that he is one and there is no other. To love him with all your heart, with all your understanding and strength, and to love your neighbour as yourself, this is far more important than any holocaust or sacrifice.' Jesus, seeing how wisely he had spoken, said, 'You are not far from the kingdom of God.' And after that no one dared to question him any more.
