#### From Fr Trevor

The Lord Jesus speaks strong words again in this weekend's Gospel. "If your eye should cause you to sin, tear it out," for in the end it is better to be the one-eyed person in the Kingdom of Heaven than to have two in the other place! The thing about this strong teaching, and others like it, is finding the space between not taking this too literally, but nor simply dismissing it as hyperbole. Yes, taken too literally, many of us would be compelled to pluck out an eye. Yet, if taken only as hyperbole, we trivialise sin and make light of Jesus' teaching. Our Lord came for the sick and the sinner, so I don't know why we



wouldn't want to see ourselves in these categories!. He has a soft spot for such as these. Yet Jesus was stern against sin. The sinfulness of people literally cost His life! In the Gospel today, Jesus is serious about sin and how important it is to root it out from our day to day behaviour. We should take Him literally on that. For not just once but three times our Lord alludes to the reality of the fires of hell. Perhaps "an obstacle to bring down" those "little ones who have faith" is sometimes our own sin, maybe pride, sloth, or anger. Or perhaps the obstacle we place before others is our own taking sin lightly. Those around us might say, 'why should I carry on going to church and believing in God if you're so proud, lazy, materialistic or angry?'

By the time you come to Mass this weekend (well after I've printed this newsletter), the Grand final will be over. Only one team wins the trophy but every team's painstaking efforts contribute to making footy such a great sport to watch. Is it a Queensland vs New South Wales granny or Fitzroy vs. South Melbourne? Hailing from the Gold Coast, I hope the Lions take the prize this year! I also hope the losers don't abandon all will to live! I've heard it said the game played in heaven is rugby anyway...

This weekend we welcome little Isabel Mae Dobriansky Speer into God's family through the Sacrament of Baptism. What a joy to be welcoming new life into God's Church. Thank you to those volunteers who helped with morning tea this Sunday! It's nice to be able to welcome Isabel and family!

# Liturgy of the Word

First reading Numbers 11:25-29

The Lord came down in the Cloud. He spoke with Moses, but took some of the spirit that was on him and put it on the seventy elders. When the spirit came on them they prophesied, but not again.

Two men had stayed back in the camp; one was called Eldad and the other Medad. The spirit came down on them; though they had not gone to the Tent, their names were enrolled among the rest. These began to prophesy in the camp. The young man ran to tell this to Moses, 'Look,' he said, 'Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp.' Then said Joshua the son of Nun, who had served Moses from his youth, 'My Lord Moses, stop them!' Moses answered him, 'Are you jealous on my account? If only the whole people of the Lord were prophets, and the Lord gave his Spirit to them all!'

An answer for the rich. Start crying, weep for the miseries that are coming to you. Your wealth is all rotting, your clothes are all eaten up by moths. All your gold and your silver are corroding away, and the same corrosion will be your own sentence, and eat into your body. It was a burning fire that you stored up as your treasure for the last days. Labourers mowed your fields, and you cheated them – listen to the wages that you kept back, calling out; realise that the cries of the reapers have reached the ears of the Lord of hosts. On earth you have had a life of

comfort and luxury; in the time of slaughter you went on eating to your heart's content. It was you who condemned the innocent and killed them; they offered you no resistance.

Gospel Mark 9:38-43,45,47-48

John said to Jesus, 'Master, we saw a man who is not one of us casting out devils in your name; and because he was not one of us we tried to stop him.' But Jesus said, 'You must not stop him: no one who works a miracle in my name is likely to speak evil of me. Anyone who is not against us is for us.

'If anyone gives you a cup of water to drink just because you belong to Christ, then I tell you solemnly, he will most certainly not lose his reward.

'But anyone who is an obstacle to bring down one of these little ones who have faith, would be better thrown into the sea with a great millstone round his neck. And if your hand should cause you to sin, cut it off; it is better for you to enter into life crippled, than to have two hands and go to hell, into the fire that cannot be put out. And if your foot should cause you to sin, cut it off; it is better for you to enter into life lame, than to have two feet and be thrown into hell. And if your eye should cause you to sin, tear it out; it is better for you to enter into the kingdom of God with one eye, than to have two eyes and be thrown into hell where their worm does not die nor their fire go out.'
