#### From Fr Trevor

Christmas is upon us! It seems so close yet this Sunday we are still waiting for the advent of the solemn festival Tuesday evening. We wouldn't want any false starts! Did you know that the Church celebrates Christmas all the way up until the feast of the Lord's Baptism on Sunday January 12? Catholics have always loved a feast, and what better reason than the wondrous Incarnation of God the Son! We also have periods when we are called to fast and exercise more self-restraint, such as Fridays in Lent, and Advent. As the good book says, "To everything there is a season ... a time to mourn, and a time to dance" (Ecclesiastes 3:1a, 4b). So when the shops pack it all down on boxing day (actually St Stephen's day traditionally), and when your neighbours make comments at us leaving our tree up, remind them who you are. We're Catholic, and the joy of Christmas is so great that it will extend all the way to mid-January.

This Sunday we begin Mass with the marvellous opening prayer traditionally prayed at noon, the *Angelus*. "Pour forth, we beseech you, O Lord, your grace into our hearts, that we, to whom the Incarnation of Christ your Son was made known by the message of an Angel, may by his Passion and Cross be brought to the glory of his Resurrection." In the Gospel, we reflect on the beautiful visitation of the Blessed Mary to her cousin Elizabeth. Their exchange strikes us, "Of all women you are the most blessed, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. Why should I be honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord?" How did she know that the child in Mary's Immaculate womb was the Lord, her Lord? She was "filled with the Holy Spirit," as we are too thanks to the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation & the spiritual life of prayer.

The new Parish Priest for Sacred Heart has been announced and arrives February 14! (How Romantic!) Fr Michael Kong is a few years older than me and has a bit more parish experience! I'm sure you'll warm to one another very quickly, and that he'll serve this community well. Fr Michael has just completed a postgraduate degree in Rome and will most likely have a second part time role in the Archdiocese as I have had this year. He also appears to have an *Instagram* (@papadonpreach)! Only one more Sunday for me here unfortunately (29<sup>th</sup> Dec), although I'll be in and out early next year to move things and to help get Fr Michael up to speed! I've asked Niccolo to put me at the top of the supply list should Father Michael ever be on leave or unwell.

## Liturgy of the Word

First reading Micah 5:1-4

The Lord says this:

You, Bethlehem Ephrathah, the least of the clans of Judah, out of you will be born for me the one who is to rule over Israel; his origin goes back to the distant past, to the days of old. The Lord is therefore going to abandon them till the time when she who is to give birth gives birth. Then the remnant of his brothers will come back to the sons of Israel. He will stand and feed his flock with the power of the Lord, with the majesty of the name of his God. They will live secure, for from then on he will extend his power to the ends of the land. He himself will be peace.

Second reading Hebrews 10:5-10

This is what Christ said, on coming into the world:
You who wanted no sacrifice or oblation,
prepared a body for me.
You took no pleasure in holocausts or sacrifices for sin;
then I said,
just as I was commanded in the scroll of the book

just as I was commanded in the scroll of the book, 'God, here I am! I am coming to obey your will.'

Notice that he says first: You did not want what the Law lays down as the things to be offered, that is: the sacrifices, the oblations, the holocausts and the sacrifices for sin, and you took no pleasure in them; and then he says: Here I am! I am coming to obey your will. He is abolishing the first sort to replace it with the second. And this will was for us to be made holy by the offering of his body made once and for all by Jesus Christ.

Gospel Luke 1:39-45

Mary set out and went as quickly as she could to a town in the hill country of Judah. She went into Zechariah's house and greeted Elizabeth. Now as soon as Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leapt in her womb and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. She gave a loud cry and said, 'Of all women you are the most blessed, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. Why should I be honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord? For the moment your greeting reached my ears, the child in my womb leapt for joy. Yes, blessed is she who believed that the promise made her by the Lord would be fulfilled.'
