The 1st Sunday of Lent Year C highlights the theme of salvation for all. In Romans 10:12-13, Paul tells us that salvation is available to everyone who calls on the Lord. This message reminds us that God's love and mercy are open to all people, regardless of their background.

This inclusiveness is central to the Gospel. Paul emphasizes that there is no difference between Jew and Gentile. Anyone who believes in Jesus and calls on His name will be saved. This universal offer of salvation shows us that God's love knows no boundaries.

We are called to share this message with others. Just as God's love is inclusive, so should our outreach be. We should welcome and support everyone in their journey toward faith. Our actions should reflect the inclusiveness of God's love.

Living out this message means being open to others. It means being willing to listen, help, and guide those who seek God. It also means living a life that reflects God's love and mercy, showing others the way to salvation through our example.

As we begin Lent, let's remember that salvation is for everyone. We are all called to share this good news with the world. Let us be instruments of God's inclusive love, welcoming all who seek Him.

In the Gospel of Luke 4:1-13, Jesus faces three significant temptations in the desert. Each temptation tests His commitment to His mission and His trust in God.

The first temptation is for physical comfort. The devil challenges Jesus to turn stones into bread. Jesus resists, showing that His mission is not about satisfying His own needs but about fulfilling God's will.

The second temptation is for worldly power. The devil offers Jesus all the kingdoms of the world if He will worship him. Jesus rejects this, choosing the Kingdom of God over earthly authority. This decision points to His ultimate sacrifice on the cross.

The third temptation is for glory. The devil tells Jesus to throw Himself from the temple and let the angels save Him. Jesus resists, focusing on His mission rather than seeking personal glory. He uses His power only for God's purpose, not for His own benefit.

These temptations are relevant to us as well. We face similar challenges in our lives. By following Jesus' example, we can resist temptations and stay focused on our mission to serve God and others.

Entrance Antiphon: When he calls on me, I will answer him; I will deliver him and give him glory, I will grant him length of days.

First reading

Deuteronomy 26:4-10

Moses said to the people: 'The priest shall take the pannier from your hand and lay it before the altar of the Lord your God. Then, in the sight of the Lord your God, you must make this pronouncement:

"My father was a wandering Aramaean. He went down into Egypt to find refuge there, few in numbers; but there he became a nation, great, mighty, and strong. The Egyptians ill-treated us, they gave us no peace and inflicted harsh slavery on us. But we called on the Lord, the God of our fathers. The Lord heard our voice and saw our misery, our toil and our oppression; and the Lord brought us out of Egypt with mighty hand and outstretched arm, with great terror, and with signs and wonders. He brought us here and gave us this land, a land where milk and honey flow. Here then I bring the first-fruits of the produce of the soil that you, the Lord, have given me."

'You must then lay them before the Lord your God, and bow down in the sight of the Lord your God.'

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 91: 2-3, 13-16

R. Be with me, Lord, when I am in trouble.

He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High and abides in the shade of the Almighty says to the Lord: 'My refuge, my stronghold, my God in whom I trust!' R.

Upon you no evil shall fall, no plague approach where you dwell. For you has he commanded his angels to keep you in all your ways. **R**.

They shall bear you upon their hands lest you strike your foot against a stone. On the lion and the viper you will tread and trample the young lion and the dragon. **R.**

His love he set on me, so I will rescue him; protect him for he knows my name.
When he calls I shall answer: 'I am with you.'

Second reading Romans 10: 8-13

Scripture says: *The word* (that is the faith we proclaim) *is very near to you, it is on your lips and in your heart*. If your lips confess that Jesus is Lord and if you believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, then you will be saved. By believing from the heart you are made righteous; by confessing with your lips you are saved. When scripture says: *those who believe in him will have no cause for shame*, it makes no distinction between Jew and Greek: all belong to the same Lord who is rich enough, however many ask his help, *for everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved*.

Gospel Acclamation

Gospel Luke 14: 1-3

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit through the wilderness, being tempted there by the devil for forty days. During that time he ate nothing and at the end he was hungry. Then the devil said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to turn into a loaf.' But Jesus replied, 'Scripture says: Man does not live on bread alone.'

Then leading him to a height, the devil showed him in a moment of time all the kingdoms of the world and said to him, 'I will give you all this power and the glory of these kingdoms, for it has been committed to me and I give it to anyone I choose. Worship me, then, and it shall all be yours.' But Jesus answered him, 'Scripture says:

You must worship the Lord your God,

and serve him alone.'

Then he led him to Jerusalem and made him stand on the parapet of the Temple. 'If you are the Son of God,' he said to him 'throw yourself down from here, for scripture says:

He will put his angels in charge of you

to guard you,

and again:

They will hold you up on their hands

in case you hurt your foot against a stone.'

But Jesus answered him, 'It has been said:

You must not put the Lord your God to the test.'

Having exhausted all these ways of tempting him, the devil left him, to return at the appointed time.
