From Fr Trevor

We thank God for the fourteen young students who received the Sacrament of Confirmation on Thursday. Congratulations to these young people too as they complete their Sacraments of initiation in the Church. It was great see so many people here, and to have our choir acompany the Mass with Fr Tony Kerin. Please pray for our young people that the flame of faith may be kept burning brightly in their hearts.

In the Gospel this weekend our Lord Jesus is asked, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?" You might expect Jesus to reply that heaven is not something we *earn* but a free gift of God. Jesus does not say that here. He distinguishes between what we *must*



do and we *could* we do. Our relationship with the Lord certainly entails some obligations towards Him and our neighbour, yet the ten commandments are something of a minimum. Jesus comes to show us that "unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven" (Matt 5:20). Like the rich young man in the Gospel, the "Good Master" sees us trying to do the right thing each day, and loves us. Yet in love He also challenges us to a greatness above and beyond the "dos and don'ts," because the way to heaven is not just about following rules. Jesus calls us to let go of our preoccupations with worldly prosperity, and *to come follow Him*. I'll never forget that opening line of Benedict XVI's first encyclical letter, *Deus Caritas Est:* "Being Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction." After all, following Him is the primary relationship that makes the "dos and don'ts" make sense in the first place.

It's not easy trying to administrate a parish for the first time without help in the office, and thank you to all of you for your generous offer of assistance. And a big thank you to our volunteers who help with tea and coffee this Sunday.

Gospel Mark 10:17-27

Jesus was setting out on a journey when a man ran up, knelt before him and put this question to him, 'Good master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' Jesus said to him, 'Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: You must not kill; You must not commit adultery; You must not steal; You must not bring false witness; You must not defraud; Honour your father and mother.' And he said to him, 'Master, I have kept all these from my earliest days.' Jesus looked steadily at him and loved him, and he said, 'There is one thing you lack. Go and sell everything you own and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.' But his face fell at these words and he went away sad, for he was a man of great wealth.

Jesus looked round and said to his disciples, 'How hard it is for those who have riches to enter the kingdom of God!' The disciples were astounded by these words, but Jesus insisted, 'My

children,' he said to them 'how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God.' They were more astonished than ever. 'In that case' they said to one another 'who can be saved?' Jesus gazed at them. 'For men' he said 'it is impossible, but not for God: because everything is possible for God.'
