From Fr Trevor

Last week I said that Advent tries to attune us to the fact that Christ has come in His wondrous Incarnation, Christ comes now invisibly through Grace and Christ will come again in glory. Fr Michael Rafter was Parish Priest of Sacred Heart 1977-1995 and much loved. He composed a beautiful poem masterfully connecting the first coming with the "interim coming" in the holy Eucharist. He called it, "Mass Meeting."

It's not so very, very far
From Bethlehem to Calvary —
From Bethlehem where stood the star
To Calvary where stood the tree.

It's just up to Jerusalem And just outside the city wall: To Calvary from Bethlehem It's not so very far at all.

But Bethlehem where Christ was born Is nearer even than we know To where, abandoned and forlorn, He died for us in grief and woe.

"This is my body, this my blood," And Christ is born. But in that birth His body and his precious blood Show forth his death to all on earth.

So Calvary and Bethlehem
Are not so far apart, alas,
As fondly we imagine them —
They meet in every Mass.

This Saturday we welcome the Kew community for carols, and the school had here too carols Thursday night. We hope to welcome people also to our Parish Lessons & Carols. In this beautiful tradition, we sing and mediate on the mysteries of our Lord Jesus' birth, as our hearts are lifted up by the sounds of heavenly music of *Chorus Ecclesiae*. The following evening, we have our parish end of year dinner in the hall at 7pm, with special guest, my father, Tony! It's wonderful to be a part of this community.

Liturgy of the Word

First reading Baruch 5:1-9

Jerusalem, take off your dress of sorrow and distress, put on the beauty of the glory of God for ever, wrap the cloak of the integrity of God around you, put the diadem of the glory of the Eternal on your head: since God means to show your splendour to every nation under heaven, since the name God gives you for ever will be, 'Peace through integrity, and honour through devotedness.' Arise, Jerusalem, stand on the heights and turn your eyes to the east: see your sons reassembled from west and east at the command of the Holy One, jubilant that God has remembered them. Though they left you on foot, with enemies for an escort, now God brings them back to you like royal princes carried back in glory. For God has decreed the flattening of each high mountain, of the everlasting hills, the filling of the valleys to make the ground level so that Israel can walk in safety under the glory of God. And the forests and every fragrant tree will provide shade for Israel at the command of God; for God will guide Israel in joy by the light of his glory with his mercy and integrity for escort.

I am quite certain that the One who began this good work in you will see that it is finished when the Day of Christ Jesus comes; and God knows how much I miss you all, loving you as Christ Jesus loves you. My prayer is that your love for each other may increase more and more and never stop improving your knowledge and deepening your perception so that you can always recognise what is best. This will help you to become pure and blameless, and prepare you for the Day of Christ, when you will reach the perfect goodness which Jesus Christ produces in us for the glory and praise of God.

Gospel Luke 3:1-6

In the fifteenth year of Tiberius Caesar's reign, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judaea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of the lands of Ituraea and Trachonitis, Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene, during the pontificate of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah, in the wilderness. He went through the whole Jordan district proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the sayings of the prophet Isaiah: A voice cries in the wilderness: Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley will be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, winding ways will be straightened and rough roads made smooth. And all mankind shall see the salvation of God.
