

SACRED HEART

As He often does, our Lord Jesus says a number of striking things in this weekend's Gospel reading. St Peter, effectively the first Pope of the Church, confidently affirms his faith in Jesus as the Christ, the Messiah for whom Israel had been waiting so long. We forget how radical such a claim really was at the time! Today "Christ" has almost become a kind of "surname" for our Lord Jesus, but of course it means much more than that. Upon hearing of the true Messiah's plan to lay down His life as a ransom for many, St Peter cannot square this with his idea of what the Messiah should be like. The believers of his day were



confident that the Messiah would overthrow the Roman domination and restore Israel to its former independence. But Jesus says, "the way you think is not God's way but a human way." God's way is one of self-sacrifice. God's way is the cross. This is his throne from which he reigns. No cross, no crown; no pain, no gain. It's not suffering for its own sake, but it's freely suffering for the good of the other. We cannot really be Christians, followers of the Christ, without struggling together along this way of the cross which is really the way of salvation and the way of love.

Speaking of the cross, part of my share in the cross this week was seeing Hawthorn fall short so close to the Prelim after such a shocking start to the season! Not everyone can win it. ... But if Sicily had just kicked that goal!

As term 3 comes to an end this week we wish our school students a good break and hope the teachers get a rest too! First week back term 4 are Confirmations (Thursday night 7pm) with our parish choir. Please come along to pray for them, and to welcome these students and families.

The funeral Mass for **Alla Tamowicz** will be at 11am on Tuesday (17th September). **Mavis Ryan** has also passed away at 98 years of age. Some of you may remember her from Fr Malcom's days in the parish. And I must mention her late husband was president of the Hawthorn football club. The funeral Mass looks like it will be 11am on Tuesday the 24th. We pray *eternal rest grant unto them O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace, Amen.*

Second reading

Take the case, my brothers, of someone who has never done a single good act but claims that he has faith. Will that faith save him? If one of the brothers or one of the sisters is in need of clothes and has not enough food to live on, and one of you says to them, 'I wish you well; keep yourself warm and eat plenty', without giving them these bare necessities of life, then what good is that? Faith is like that: if good works do not go with it, it is quite dead.

This is the way to talk to people of that kind: 'You say you have faith and I have good deeds; I will prove to you that I have faith by showing you my good deeds – now you prove to me that you have faith without any good deeds to show.'

Gospel

Jesus and his disciples left for the villages round Caesarea Philippi. On the way he put this question to his disciples, 'Who do people say I am?' And they told him. 'John the Baptist,' they said 'others Elijah; others again, one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he asked 'who do you say I am?' Peter spoke up and said to him, 'You are the Christ.' And he gave them strict orders not to tell anyone about him.

And he began to teach them that the Son of Man was destined to suffer grievously, to be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes, and to be put to death, and after three days to rise again; and he said all this quite openly. Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. But, turning and seeing his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said to him, 'Get behind me, Satan! Because the way you think is not God's way but man's.'

He called the people and his disciples to him and said, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it.'
